## **PPS 2015 ABSTRACT SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- Abstract submissions may not have already been published or currently be under consideration for publication elsewhere.
- Abstracts will be judged on the following criteria:
  - Significance of hypothesis
  - Valid conclusion(s)
  - Argument clarity
  - Presentation quality
- The body of the text may contain a maximum of 254 words. Additionally, it **must** be organized under (and contain) **all** of the following headings:
  - Context
  - o Design
  - Results
  - Conclusions

Do not use any additional or alternative headings.

- The text must be prepared in accordance with the American Medical Association Manual of Style, 10th edition. For more information and specific examples of how abstracts should be prepared, see CAP '12 abstracts that were published in the September 2012 issue of Archives of Pathology & Laboratory Medicine (available online at: <u>http://www.archivesofpathology.org</u>).
- Do not use abbreviations unless they appear 5 or more times, in which case you must spell out the abbreviation or acronym the first time it appears.
- Do not begin the abstract by repeating the title, and do not cite references.
- Affiliations for each author must be clearly listed, including full department and institution names. Spell out this information; do not use abbreviations or acronyms.
- Each author must sign and submit an Authorship Form.
- List sources (name of company, city, state, and country) for all software and reagents.
- Use conventional units of measure.
- Use generic drug names unless the specific trade name of a drug is directly relevant to the discussion.
- Carefully check the spelling and grammar using a word processing program, such as Word, prior to submitting your abstract.
- Take time to review your abstract and verify its accuracy prior to submitting it.
- Retrospective studies should be written in the past tense consistently throughout the text.
