#### 2009-2010 Pathologist-in-Training Travel Award

The PPS Pathologist-in-Training Travel Award provides a stipend of \$1,750 to one pathologist-in-training (PPS member resident or fellow) for the study of pulmonary pathology with a member of PPS. The stipend is intended to support the costs of travel and/or living expenses for a one-month period of study. Applicants must be a member of PPS. Applicants who are not members of PPS may submit their membership application along with the Pathologist-in-Training Travel Award application. (*Deadline: November 1, 2008*)

#### 2009 Trainee Awards

The PPS Awards Committee presents up to five awards for the best pulmonary pathology presentations submitted by trainees at the annual USCAP meeting. A trainee is defined as a medical student, resident, or fellow in Pathology. In addition, other applicants such as graduate students (MS, PhD, veterinary, etc.) and post-docs (without a faculty appointment) may also qualify for consideration. Presentations at the USCAP meeting may be in platform or poster format and are evaluated on the basis of scientific validity, originality, academic and clinical importance, and quality of presentation. The trainee must be listed as the first author. This award is not related to other awards presented during the USCAP Annual Meeting. Qualified applicants must apply for this award to PPS (*Deadline for PPS Award Application: TBD*).

The deadline to submit abstracts to the USCAP 2009 Annual Meeting is **September 15, 2008**.

## Committee Updates

The PPS Program Committee has finalized the programs for the upcoming **2009 PPS Companion Society Meeting for the USCAP annual meeting in Boston, Massachusetts, scheduled for Saturday evening, March 7, 2009**, and the upcoming **2009 PPS Biennial Meeting, June 24-26, 2009 in Portland, Oregon**.

The 2009 USCAP-PPS Companion Society Meeting's theme will be **Smoking Related Lung Disease**, co-moderated by Eugene Mark, M.D., and Armando Fraire, M.D. The speakers include Jeff Galvin, M.D. and Teri J. Franks, M.D., addressing the clinico-radio-pathologic correlation of smoking related lung diseases; Keith Kerr, M.D., discussing smoking-related airway field carcinogenesis and the molecular basis of preneoplasia; and Mary Beth Beasley, M.D., giving an update on smoking-related small airways disease.

The 2009 PPS Biennial Meeting, June 24-26, 2009 in Portland, Oregon, will be highlighted by a keynote address from Robert Homer, M.D. entitled "**New Insights into the Molecular Biology of Interstitial Lung Disease**." David Dail will speak about the history of pulmonary pathology as the PPS dinner presentation. The sessions will present updates of pulmonary neoplasia, non-neoplastic lung disease, pleural neoplasia, and asbestos, asbestosis, and associated malignancies. Session chairs are included on page 5.

Other highlights of the meeting include debates and panel discussions. There will be a debate entitled "**Asbestos Exposure and Lung Cancer**," moderated by Philip T. Cagle, M.D. and Koichi Honma, M.D., with Richard Attanoos, M.D. and Allen Gibbs, M.D. discussing the "pros;" and Sam Hammar, M.D. and Victor Roggli, M.D. discussing the "cons." The debate is followed by a discussion of mesothelioma and occupational lung disease by a panel of pulmonary pathologists including Francoise Galateau-Salle, M.D., Andrew Churg, M.D., Helmut Popper, M.D., Victor Roggli, M.D., and Douglas Henderson, M.D. The program also features a debate entitled "**Consensus Classifications Revisited: Pros and Cons of the WHO Classification for Neuroendocrine Tumors**" with Mary Beth Beasley, M.D. discussing the "pros" and William D. Travis, M.D. discussing the "cons." That debate is followed by a panel discussion on pulmonary neoplasia that includes William D. Travis, M.D., Mary Beth Beasley, M.D., Douglas Flieder, M.D., Michael Koss, M.D., Teri J. Franks, M.D., and Masayuki Noguchi, M.D. (*Continued on page 6*)

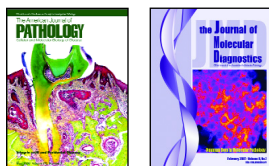
## Nominating Committee

In early 2008, the PPS Council voted in favor of creating a new Council position of Councilor representing Latin America. At the request of the Council and President Don Guinee, the Nominating Committee has conducted its business to find a nominee for this new position. The Nominating Committee has unanimously approved Dr. Vera Capelozzi of Brazil as the nominee for the position of Councilor representing Latin America. Dr. Capelozzi is a Professor in the Department of Pathology, Faculty of Medicine, University of São Paulo, São Paulo, Brazil. She has over 100 peer-review publications in clinical and basic lung pathology research, including research in molecular pathology of metastasis, molecular pathology of acute lung injury and mouse and rabbit models of lung injury mechanics. She is a frequently invited speaker to many Latin American and European pathology congresses.

The Pulmonary Pathology Society was established to encourage education and research in the field of pulmonary pathology and to provide a forum for those interested in pulmonary pathology to exchange ideas and form collaborations. Toward this objective, the PPS holds scientific conferences three times a year: a Session at the ASIP Annual Meeting at Experimental Biology, a Companion Meeting with the USCAP, and a three-day Biennial Symposium alternating every other year with sessions at the International Academy of Pathology.

The PPS offers awards to trainees for the best presentation in pulmonary pathology at the USCAP Annual Meeting, a stipend for residents and fellows to train in pulmonary pathology for one month at an institution of their choice, and a Lifetime Achievement Award to recognize those individuals whose careers have made a major impact on pulmonary pathology. 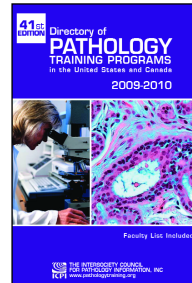

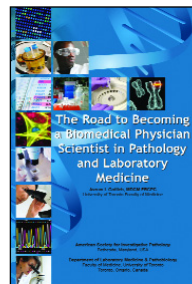

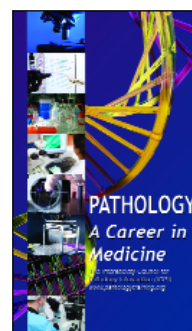
