ACADEMIC SURGICAL PATHOLOGIST WITH A FOCUS IN PULMONARY PATHOLOGY

The Department of Pathology, Immunology and Laboratory Medicine at the University of Florida College of Medicine invites applications for a faculty position at the Assistant/Associate/Full Professor level (tenure track or non-tenure, clinical track) for a surgical pathologist with a focus in Pulmonary Pathology. Applicants must have an M.D. or D.O. degree, board certification in Anatomic Pathology or AP/CP, and possess or be eligible for a Florida Medical license. Fellowship training in pulmonary pathology is highly desirable. Primary responsibilities will involve service and clinical teaching in surgical pathology with a focus in pulmonary pathology. The candidate should also have a strong track record of publications and clinical research activity. The University of Florida/Shands Health Care affiliated institutions present a rich diversity of inpatient and outpatient clinical material. The successful applicant will contribute to medical student, resident and fellowship training in accredited programs within Pathology including pulmonary pathology. Scholarly studies and investigations in the applicant's areas of interest are expected. Salary and rank are negotiable, commensurate with experience.

The final candidate will be required to provide an official transcript to the hiring department upon hire. A transcript will not be considered "official" if a designation of "Issued to Student" is visible. Degrees earned from an education institution outside of the United States are required to be evaluated by a professional credentialing service provider approved by the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES), which can be found at <http://www.naces.org/>
